

Canora Junior Elementary School is a very busy and exciting school located within Treaty 4 Territory and the Traditional Homeland of the Metis Nation. We offer Pre-Kindergarten to Grade 4 Saskatchewan Ministry of Education curricular programming and service approximately 175 students from Canora and surrounding rural areas.

Our school and our classrooms are welcoming, calming, and are fully equipped to deliver learning in an environment that is supportive of many diverse learning needs throughout the school. We also have a beautiful fully serviced library, gymnasium, kitchen, student support sensory room, an outdoor school garden, and a large playground with many different pieces of play equipment areas for our students to access. We are also in the process of fundraising and are planning to build an inclusive outdoor classroom learning space and swing area of the playground.

Our aim is to provide our students with a safe and positive environment within which to grow and learn, and we are proud to offer a variety of activities for our students to participate in throughout the school day. Attendance

Policy

- Students are expected to attend each day, on time.
- If your child is going to be absent or late, we ask that you notify the school office on or before the day of
 occurrence. This can be done through EDSBY <u>or</u> by contacting the office via phone (306) 563-5611.
- Phone calls to parents/guardians will be made for students who have non-excused absence.
- Students who arrive after start times are to report to the office to check in before going to their classroom.
- Students with chronic absenteeism will be monitored following <u>Administrative Procedure 340, Attendance</u> of <u>Students</u>

Guidelines

- Attendance is a crucial part of being successful at Canora Junior Elementary School. Most of what students learn daily comes from conversations, teacher guidance, hands on learning and collaboration with others in person in the classroom. Catching up on homework only helps students catch up on <u>some</u> of what was taught and learned.
- If your child is not feeling well, we ask that you do not send them to school. If students fall ill throughout the school day, your child's teacher or the office will contact you.



Arrivals



• Students may arrive at school between 8:45am and 8:55am. Supervision is **NOT** provided on school grounds prior to 8:45am. Upon arrival, students may play on the playground between 8:45am and 8:55am until the bell rings for school to begin.

• Parents/guardians who are dropping students off at school are asked to do so on the **NORTH** side of the school, facing East, curbside, on 2nd Avenue E. Please do not motion for your child to run across the street.

- All outdoor shoes are to be placed on the boot racks assigned to your classroom.
- Hats are to be removed upon entering the school unless it is a spirit day.

Bus, Bicycle, Walking, & Parking Safety

Buses:

- All school buses will load and unload on the SOUTH side of the school, facing West, curbside, on 3rd Avenue E. This is a designated bus loading and unloading zone and therefore, no other public parking is permitted in this area from 8:00-9:00 am and 3:00-4:00pm.
- Both the bus driver and the school must be notified if a student will not be riding the bus either before or after school. Also see, <u>Student Transportation Code of</u> <u>Conduct</u>

Bicycles:

- All students must follow bicycle safety rules. Bike helmets are mandatory at CJES. We are a "No helmet-No bike allowed" school.
- Bicycles are to be walked on the sidewalks in front of the school and on playground and must be placed immediately into the bicycle racks. Bicycles are to remain in the bicycle racks until the student is to return home. Students are encouraged to lock their bicycles.

Walking Students:

- All students must use the crosswalks when crossing the street and are encouraged to make use of the intersections controlled by safety lights, crosswalks, and/or Safety Patrollers.
- Students are also to follow all pedestrian safety rules.

Parent/Guardian Parking:

- Parents/guardians who are picking up or dropping students off at school are asked to do so on the NORTH side of the school, facing East, curbside, on 2nd Avenue E. Please do not motion for your child to run across the street.
- Parents who are visiting the school are asked to find parking on any street surrounding the school except (as described above) in the bus loading/unloading zone on 3rd Avenue E.

Staff Parking Lot:

- Only Canora Junior Elementary School staff or Good Spirit School Division staff can access the parking lots.
- It is not safe for any parent/guardian or child to be in or to walk through the parking lots at any time of the school day.









Dismissals

- The bell for bus students' rings at 3:15. At that time, all bus students begin getting ready for end of day dismissal.
- Once ready, all bus students go to their bus line and wait to be escorted to the front sidewalk to board the buses by a bus supervisor. Town students will remain in their classrooms to ensure their safety while the buses are leaving.
- Once the 3:20 bell rings AND all the buses have left, town students and those being picked up by family will be dismissed from the school.
- Parents/guardians who are picking up at school are asked to do so on the NORTH side of the school, facing East, curbside, on 2nd Avenue E. Please do not motion for your child to run across the street.
- We appreciate your promptness in picking up your children no later than 3:30pm
- We ask that all parents wait outside of the school during dismissal time to pick up their children.
- After school, students are to go directly home and not play on the playground, unless they are supervised by a parent or guardian.
- Please call the school if your child is to go to an alternate place after school or is not going on their regular bus. We ask that this communication occur prior to 2:30 pm. If there is no note or phone call, from a parent or guardian, your child will be sent home following their normal daily routine.



Doors

- To ensure the safety of all students and staff, all school entrance doors will be locked at 8:55 apart from the main doors of the school which will remain open until 9:30. Supervising teachers and custodial staff will ensure the doors are then locked for the remainder of the day.
- Visitors are asked to call the front office upon arrival or to make an appointment.

Edsby

- The primary form of communication between home and school will be Edsby. Both the school and your child's teacher will use this platform.
- If you have not registered for this app, please download the app onto your smartphone and contact the school office to request an invitation be sent to you.
- If you have more than one child, invitations will be sent for each child, and you must accept each invitation separately to access information for each child. Follow the links in the invitation email (for each child) to set up this app.
- All your child's grades, assignments and report cards will be posted and accessible to view on Edsby.
- Notices from the school will also be posted in Edsby.
- You can also report your child's absence through Edsby.
- Please ensure that you have all notifications from Edsby turn "ON" so you do not miss any communications from the school.



Expectations/Code of Conduct

Rights and Responsibilities

- I have a right to learn ... and a responsibility to be on time, to be prepared, to listen to instructions, and to work without disturbing others.
- I have a right to hear and be heard ... and a responsibility to listen to others.
- I have a right to be respected ... and a responsibility to treat others with respect.
- I have a right to be safe ... and a responsibility to respect the personal safety of others.
- I have a right to privacy and my own personal space ... and a responsibility to respect others' privacy and personal space.

No Excuses

- At Canora Junior Elementary School the main priority is to foster a safe and caring environment to facilitate learning.
- One of the most important lessons our children need to be taught is self-discipline. Self-control, strength of character, and courtesy are the basics of self-discipline. It is the key to good conduct, proper consideration and respect for oneself, other people's property, and the school environment. Students are expected to maintain self-discipline while at school.
- The bottom line is that there is NO EXCUSE for aggressive, rude, disrespectful, or hands on behaviour at school...ever. Students are given a wide range of strategies for self-discipline, problem-solving, mindfulness, and peaceful management. Students are expected to use these strategies and take responsibility for their own actions and words.

Illness

- If your child is not feeling well, we ask that you do not send them to school. If students fall ill throughout the school day, your child's teacher or the office will contact you.
- The Saskatchewan Health Authority has provided a great reference for parents entitled <u>Is My Child Too Sick</u> <u>To Attend School?</u> Please use it as a guide to help in making decisions regarding school attendance.
- The <u>Communicable Disease Guidelines</u> sheet is another resource that can be utilized to support in making informed decisions regarding your child's health. In the event of a confirmed case of a Communicable Disease from public health, we will follow <u>Administrative Procedure 161</u>.
- In the case of <u>Head Lice, Administrative Procedure 318</u> will be followed.





Lost and Found



- Each year a large amount of clothing, footwear, and other articles are accumulated in the school "Lost and Found" bins. Many of these articles are never claimed.
- To prevent this, please have clothing, footwear, shoes, and school supplies clearly labeled with your child's first and last name.
- Unclaimed items are boxed up at the end of each Term and donated.

Medical Needs, Medication Administration

& Medical Alerts

Medical Needs

• All families are asked to report any medical needs to both the student's teacher and the school office. Once we are notified, a member of the Student Support team will work with the family to create and/or update a medical response plan. Medical response plans are shared with staff.



Medication Administration

The Board of Education recognizes that medical circumstances may arise which may lead to a request that
prescription medication be administered to a child during school hours. In in this case, GSSD's <u>Administrative
Procedure 316 – Administration of Medication to Students</u> will be followed. All relevant forms will be
completed each academic year by school, home, and doctors. Medication is kept in an assigned location and
can only be administered by authorized School Board employees at the school.

Medical Alerts

- Some students have moderate to severe allergies to a variety of foods and environmental factors.
- We here at CJES, must ensure that our school environment is safe and free from the following foods and products. Therefore, we ask for your cooperation in **NOT** sending food or items that could be deemed harmful to others in our building.
 - No Nuts of any kind (peanuts, almonds, cashews, pistachios, etc.)
 - No Fish/Seafood
- We also ask that families **NOT** send treats or snacks to school for the entire class (i.e. birthdays, holidays, etc.) as we cannot guarantee that anything prepared outside of the school is safe for any of our children with allergies.
- We thank you in advance for your support in keeping all of our students safe.

If your child fits any of the above medical categories, and you have not previously informed the school, please do so, otherwise you will be contacted by school personnel to ensure appropriate medical documentation is updated.

Morning Announcements



- Each morning, at 9:00 am, we recognize we are on Treaty 4 Territory, rise for O Canada, and listen to the daily announcements.
- Announcements include information such as upcoming dates, events, reminders, celebrations, birthdays, interesting facts, a daily writing prompt, a mindful moment, and/or Joke of the Day.

Noon Hour

- Noon hour supervision is provided daily for bus students who must stay to eat lunch at school.
- Town students are encouraged to go home for lunch.
- All students are permitted to stay for "Special Lunch" days.
- Students eat lunch in their classrooms.
- Any students who regularly stay for lunch but wish to leave the school during the noon hour, must have written permission from their parent/guardian to do so.
- All students who stay for lunch are encouraged to bring healthy foods, snacks, and drinks that are low in sugar content. Energy or sports drinks are NOT allowed at school.
- Microwaves are not in use at the school for student lunchrooms.
- Noon hour supervisors oversee students as they eat and will promote handwashing, safe eating habits, and cleanliness of space.

Recess

- There are three recess breaks throughout the school day
 - o 10:35 10:50 am
 - o 12:30-12:55 pm
 - o 2:20-2:35 pm
- All students are expected to go outdoors for fresh air and exercise during the recess breaks to promote and support brain/body breaks which will stimulate and promote learning.
- Children must be dressed appropriately for the weather conditions every day.
- We will only stay indoors for a recess break in extreme cold or if it is storming or raining heavily. <u>Administrative</u> <u>Procedure 308 – Indoor Recess / Noon Hour</u> will guide our decisions at the school level, and Environment Canada the Weather Network will be the resource to confer regarding current weather temperatures, alerts, and/or conditions.
- All recesses are supervised. Outdoor supervisors can easily be seen by the bright neon vest they wear.

 - Lunch kit (if staying for lunch every day)
- Please ensure all supplies brought from home are labeled with the student's first and last name.
- Essential (consumable) classroom and student supplies will be purchased and available at the school.
- If something classroom specific is required, the classroom teacher will contact you.

Student & School Fees:

- Student and School Fees this year are: \$75.00
- Fees will be used to cover the costs of essential (consumable) school supplies purchased by the teachers as well as other curricular events that will occur throughout the school year (field trips, assembly performances, etc). These fees are due at the end of September and can be paid by utilizing **School Cash Online**. Please see prior information in this handbook for information pertaining to School Cash Online.
- New students throughout the school year will be required to pay a pro-rated fee depending upon their arrival to the school.

Technology

- CJES respects the value of technology in the classroom, and we utilize our devices for a variety of educational purposes. Our school has a wonderful selection of technological teaching and learning supports to enhance Literacy and Numeracy, as well as basic research and keyboarding skills. We are very lucky that our School Community Council has been so supportive in purchasing many devices to further enhance our students' access to technology for learning purposes.
- Each classroom is outfitted with and has access to computers, SMARTboards, and/or iPads.
- RAZ Kids (Levelled Reading) can be accessed from both school and home.

Telephone and E-mail

- Our staff are busy teaching, supervising, and working with students all day long and will not be monitoring
 phones or emails during student time and/or learning time. If you have an urgent message for any staff
 member, please call the main school office.
- Phone messages for staff can be left with the Administrative Assistant in the main office. Whenever possible, call backs will be made during a break or before/after school or as soon as possible the next day.
- Additionally, responses to emails will occur during a break or before/after school or as soon as possible the next day.
- Students can use the office telephone if we believe it is necessary. Arranging for a friend to come over after school is not appropriate phone usage.


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Toys vs Tools

- At CJES we strongly encourage that personal toys stay at home. This minimizes distractions, disputes, and/or these items going missing or getting damaged.
- The school and classroom are learning environments whereby teachers will utilize a variety of tools for learning opportunities. Some of these tools may look like a toy but teachers will teach the specific purpose and method by which to use it in the classroom. An example of this would be number counters that look like little bears/dinosaurs or blocks that support learning in a variety of different curricular outcomes.
- Fidget spinners, Pokémon cards, and Pop-its are all considered to be toys.
- Should something be needed to occupy time on the bus, the expectation is that those items must remain in the child's backpack while at school and only be used for bus purposes. Books are great bus items.
- If a child needs a tool for sensory stimulation or as a calm down strategy, it will be discussed with parents/guardians, the school Student Support Teacher, and/or a Speech Language Pathologist and/or Occupational Therapist and built into a very specific learning plan for the child.

Volunteers and Criminal Record – Vulnerable Sector (CRVS) Searches

- For the safety of our students, <u>all volunteers</u> (field trip chaperone, classroom helper, reading to children, play day session leader, library helper, etc.) are required to complete a **Criminal Record/Vulnerable Sector** (CRVS) Search.
- A letter from the office can be obtained to confirm the volunteer request at the school with the RCMP.
- The completed and cleared CRVS must be at the school prior to your volunteering.
- Anyone who has volunteered within the past year does not need to re-do the check.
- Please check with the office well in advance of the scheduled volunteer event to ensure your cleared CRVS search is on file and up to date.
